Amanda Malvina Morris Sampler obtained by the NHA



The needlework sampler above was made in 1818 by Amanda Malvina Morris when Amanda was 9 years old.

Amanda was born in Newtown Feb. 13, 1808 and died here on Sept. 11, 1829. She was the daughter of a wealthy Newtown attorney Enos Morris and his first wife, Elizabeth Hugh. She also had seven brothers and sisters. She married John Lloyd – born 1809

She had children Enos Morris Lloyd born 1827, and Henry C. Lloyd born Jan. 30, 1829. She was buried in Old School Baptist Meeting House Cemetery, Southampton. The sampler pictures the "Bucks County Academy Building" which used to be behind the present First National Bank & Trust Co., Newtown - off of Centre Avenue in the rear of the bank. It also pictures "Old Washy" an antique fire engine which was built in Philadelphia and is owned by the Newtown Fire Association and also the Fire Association's antique hose cart plus carriages, trees and animals. It has polychrome silk threads on a linen ground. It is presently exhibited in the Hicks Room.

Funds to purchase this sampler were donated by two long time Newtown Historic Association members.

We very much appreciate their generosity to be able to bring this piece of Newtown memorabilia back to Newtown.
