NHA Archives Surveyed

During the last week of January, a team from the Historical Society of Pa. did a survey of the archival holdings of the NHA as part of its Hidden Collections Initiative for Pa. Small Archival Repositories. Under the direction of Andree Mey Miller, Project Coordinator, project surveyors Celia Caust-Ellenbogen and Faith Charlton spent 3 days reviewing our collection.

Funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the project's goal is to raise awareness of the often hidden archival collections in the many small, primarily volunteer-run historical repositories in the greater Phila. area, such as local historical societies. historic sites and small museums with archival collections and then to make them more accessible. There are an estimated 120-150 small archival repositories in the five county Phila. area. The Society will create an online directory of all small archival repositories in the 5 county Phila. area making descriptive information on the collections publicly available. The survey has already been completed in Phila. and Montgomery Counties.

Once each survey is completed, the team will issue detailed reports to repositories, including collections descriptions, assessments and information for managing their archival holdings. The NHA looks forward to seeing this report.
