200 S. State St. November General Meeting "Lincoln's Assassins" will be held on Monday, November 19th at 8:00 PM The Newtown Historic Association has invited Hugh Boyle, Exec. Director of the Grand Army of the Republic Museum & Library in Phila. to give a lecture on Lincoln's Assassins. This lecture will examine the men who were part of the conspiracy to kill Abraham Lincoln, William Seward and Andrew Johnson, on

April 14th, 1865. Who were they and why did they do it and what justice did they receive?? Mr. Boyle is also President of the Delaware Valley Civil War Round Table. He is the former publisher and book review editor of the Civil War Brigadier newspaper. He serves as an instructor at the Civil War Institute of Manor College where he gives lectures on the Life of Abraham Lincoln and his assassination.
