

The Half Moon Inn

The Half Moon Inn (Court Inn) was built by Joseph and Margaret Thornton as a Tavern in 1733. It served both travelers and residents of Newtown until 1818, when it was sold to Joseph Biggs, a hatter. It was then used by various owners as a residence, a store and an Inn. In 1964 it became the headquarters of the Newtown Historical Association. The Association is dedicated to the preservation and display of historic documents, furnishings and artifacts for all to enjoy. The Research Center is opened year round and the Inn is open for tours on Sunday afternoons in the summer and on request.
