“Presidential Assassins”

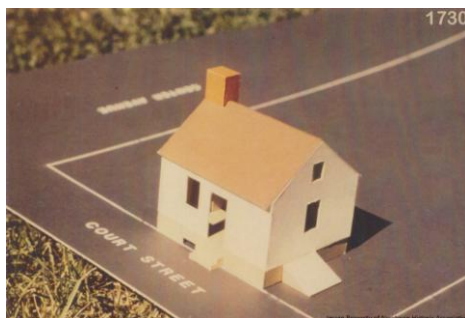
