"A Letter from the President" The Newtown Historic Association is very pleased to announce that it will be acquiring the property at 100 Mercer Street from the Veterans Association of Newtown. For those who grew up in Newtown, this building was known as the former Ambulance Garage. We were very fortunate to find a property this close to the Court Inn that fits our needs. It will provide the NHA with much needed space for our growing research center. This is a very important opportunity for the continued growth of the NHA Research Center and for its use by the community.

Today the NHA Research Center is

located on the second floor of the Court Inn. We are out of space for storing the many artifacts that we have and continue to receive. We also face accessibility issues for many people who use the stairs to reach our current Research Center. There is also concern that we have reached the weight limitations for the second floor of the Inn. Lastly, there was no off-street parking available for those using our research center. Fortunately the new research center will resolve these immediate needs. Additionally, acquiring this property also preserves the character of the community and this is the mission of the NHA.

The NHA is a non-profit organization which hosts many fund-raising events throughout the year and these events bring in thousands of people. These events also promote the historic character of Newtown, which the NHA has been instrumental in preserving. The NHA Research Center is used by nearly 2,000 people each year searching for information on people, properties, old pictures and viewing artifacts from the Newtown area. Protecting Newtown's Historic properties and character along with maintaining the Historic Court Inn and gardens is very expensive. Beyond membership dues, the NHA receives limited direct financial support from the community.

Our new Research Center will require a significant investment to renovate the building. To support this effort, we have been offered a \$25,000 matching grant. For every dollar that we raise, we will get a dollar from the grant. We ask that you consider
