



A Brief History of
The Court Inn



COURT INN, 105 COURT STREET, NEWTOWN, PA

The Court Inn, known as the Half-Moon Inn during the mid 18th century, is one of the oldest and most historic buildings in Newtown. It was the original home of Margaret and Joseph Thornton, built in 1733 as a tavern, and was a popular gathering place when Newtown was the County Seat.

He Half-moon Inn, which he now keeps, and hath done about 14 years; it is a convenient house for a tavern or store, having 4 rooms on a stoor, with fire-places in each, and two ditto above stairs; also 4 good cellars, one of which is a kitchen, with an oven and sink in it, and room for a copper to be hung(the slews already made) that adjoining to it has a fire-place; they are all well wall'd and pointed, and have inward and outward doors to each. It is the nearest to the court-house, and the court is pleased to dine at it.

The Newtown Historic Association was the recipient of the north portion of the property in 1964 as a gift from Robert L. LaRue and his wife, Ruth. The LaRues also gave \$25,000 to restore the structure. The NHA then purchased the south residence in 1974 and fully restored it in 1982. After the restoration, the two doors connecting the two properties were re-opened to make it back into one building. The Half-moon Inn (Court Inn) has served as the headquarters of the Newtown Historic Association ever since and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

At the present time, the south portion of the Half-moon Inn (Court Inn) serves as a reception area and includes several rooms that have been restored to their original décor. The north side contains the tavern room and the room behind it where the original Thornton family lived. The second floor houses the Edward Hicks room along with a restored tavern bedroom.

Artist Spotlight: Craig Hackett

Resident landscape painter Craig Hackett was born in Somers point, NJ in 1939. During World War II, the family moved to Philadelphia so that his father,



a machinist by trade, could work in a defense plant to support the family while assisting the war effort. Along with his younger brother and sister, Craig was raised in Philadelphia and

lived there until he joined the US Air Force in 1957 after high school. His four year enlistment was spent serving in Texas, New York and Iceland.

In the mid 1970's Craig decided he wanted to try his hand at painting. He began with oil pastels and within a year switched to acrylics with the expectation that this path would eventually lead him to watercolors for which he harbored a secret yearning to try. After a few years the urge to paint with watercolors became irresistible and he promptly became addicted after his initial attempt. Consequently, Craig has focused on this medium for the past thirty plus years and considers it essential to produce the results he desires for his painting of historic homes, churches and Bucks County landscapes. Being mostly selftaught, Craig's distinctive style incorporates bold color and contrast in his watercolors and acrylics which evoke a sense of energy and drama while offering the viewer a feeling of familiarity. His love of gardening and nature is evident in the whimsical landscaping found in many of his commissioned works.

At first, Hackett was drawn to Bucks simply because of the area's rich historic background, state and county parks and many beautiful landscapes. Inspired by his surroundings, he soon found himself painting historic homes, churches, and other landmarks from the Bucks County area. "I like pretty much everything about Bucks, so when I painted, it was a natural thing to do".

NEWTOWN HISTORIC ASSOCIATION RESEARCH CENTER

The NHA's Callahan Research Center on Mercer Street is a repository of records focusing on Newtown history from its founding to the present time.

The collection includes deeds, wills, diaries, genealogies, photographs, directories, inventories and maps dealing with Newtown people, land, houses, farms, schools, service organizations, events and many other topics of interest. The collections are of particular value to persons interested in genealogical information of former Newtown residents, and the maps and deeds are of assistance to those studying land history or dating historic houses in the Newtown area.

The original Research Center was opened in 1982 and the core of the collection was a gift from Edward R. Barnsley, a long time Newtown resident, collector and preservationist. The new Research Center, opened in August 2019, is located at 100 Mercer Street, Newtown – just around the corner from the Newtown Historic Association headquarters.
